A. Community sidewalks

School District:

- -Frost Road connection identified in the Transportation Master Plan.

School District:

- -Setting land aside early is important to meet planned growth and density.
- -School site acquisition charges through DCC program go toward land acquisition reserve.
- -Provincial criteria to determine capital funding for schools based on seismic upgrades, growth needs, then replacement needs.
