3.1 Review of Award Category Titles

3.2 Award Program Overview

- -Staff indicated the past year had its challenges regarding nominations. The opportunity to establish nomination committees for each category was discussed to improve the volume and quality of nominations.
- -Discussion ensued as to the reasons why nominations have become increasingly difficult and areas that could be changed.
- -Kelowna Chamber Top 40 program with Kelowna Chamber was identified and ability to push the message out thorough channels such as past nominees and those who have won before as well as considerable "door knocking".
- -Ways to further communicate with the school district were reviewed.
- -Champion of the environment City staff could be approached for more ideas on potential nominees.
- -Discussion ensued regarding the need for an active nomination subcommittee versus the Committee as a whole assisting wherever possible with nominations.
- -Consensus that a network of people to reach out to versus a nomination committee would be the most effective. A brainstorming session by the Committee to develop an extensive list to notify of the opportunity to put forth a nomination was agreed up at the start of the nomination campaign.

3.3 Discuss Key Dates and Award Delivery Format for 48th Annual Award Season

- -It will be a similar set-up as the 2022 awards.
- -The awards night and the Mayor's Reception will again be on the same night.
- -April 20, 2023, will be awards night with venue being the Laurel Packinghouse.
- -The announcement to Council of the nomination period will be on December 5th.
- -The opportunity to have past Kelowna Chamber presidents on the selection committee for the business categories was confirmed and will take place March 2023.
