- Ten-year Capital Plan Update

Parks Master Plan

Park Types

- Recreation
- City-wide
- Community
- Neighbourhood



Recreation Parks

- Focus on sport fields, courts, swimming pools and recreation centres
- Large numbers of participants and spectators
- Access demands supported by vehicular and multi-modal infrastructure
- Can include other amenities (e.g. playgrounds, picnic areas)
- Serve 45,000 within 5 Km
- Size varies, but generally large



Recreation Parks Criteria

- Sports Communities identified needs and priorities
- Located when appropriate next to existing support facilities if available flat land
- City-wide vs equal distribution





URBAN CORE BOUNDARY



City-wide Parks

- Special recreational, environmental or cultural significance
- Passive or active programing, or a combination
- Attract people throughout the City, as well as visitors
- Examples are waterfront parks, hilltops, significant viewpoints
- Variable size

 Priority for location with greatest city-wide appeal








URBAN CORE BOUNDARY

Community Parks

- Include recreational uses with limited bookings
- Sport courts, water parks, sport fields, skateparks
- Access demands supported by vehicular and multimodal infrastructure
- Includes neighbourhood park amenities (e.g.trails, playgrounds, picnic areas)
- Serve 12,000 within 3 Km
- Approximately 2 to 6 Ha



Community Parks Criteria

- Prioritization for communities with the greatest lack of parks
- Equitable distribution between communities across the City
- Balance between urban and suburban communities



Neighbourhood Parks

- Neighbourhood amenities such as playgrounds, trails, picnic areas
- Non-bookable recreation areas (sport courts, basketball)
- Serve 2,000 within 1 Km within a 5 minute walk
- Approximately 0.6 to 1 Ha



Neighbourhood Parks Criteria

- Balance between
 communities across the City
- Equal distribution over 10 years


