

Taking a Systems Approach Systems Planning is a Journey Not a Destination



Systems Planning is the analysis, planning and design of an integrated system where defined services work together to create clear pathways to prevent, reduce, and end the experience of homelessness.






System Planning Priorities

Coordinated Outreach & Shelter Coordination

- ✓ Outreach has evolved from a siloed approach to a synchronized approach through our COVID-19 response
- ✓ A weekly Coordinated Outreach Table was convened in October 2020 with 40+ staff representing 24 organizations
- ✓ Light Touch and Intensive Case Management streams to maximize capacity and enhance supports
- ✓ Working to achieve coordination between Coordinated Outreach table, Coordinated Shelter table, and Coordinated Access table





Coordinated Outreach & Shelter Coordination

- **✓** Working to coordinate outreach services with a housing, health and justice focus through discharge planning
- ✓ Some shelter providers are working to integrate their intake processes and embed a coordinated approach in maximizing shelter capacity across the system
- ✓ A Coordinated Shelter Table was convened and meeting weekly
- ✓ Shelters working collaboratively with outreach supports to find people sheltering outdoors who have been identified for shelter intake
- ✓ Enhanced case management and health supports within shelters Journey HOME



Youth Homelessness Prevention Upstream Project

- ✓ Part of a national pilot initiative to prevent youth homelessness
- ✓ Working with two local middle schools throughout 2021 KLO and Spring Valley
- ✓ Expected to survey 600-800 students to assess vulnerability for homelessness and disengagement from school
- ✓ Anticipate identifying 100+ students at risk that require supports
- ✓ Project provides direct supports and referrals to other services to ensure youth and family success

Faith Community Collective

- ✓ Faith Design Lab in Spring 2018; Interfaith Roundtable formed in December 2019
- ✓ The Faith Collective has over 40 members from the Baha'i, Christian, Hindu, Jewish, Muslim, Sikh, and Unitarian faith communities
- ✓ Co-creating a roadmap for action through a series of engagement workshops
- ✓ Aims to establish a structure that enables action, investment, and promotes collaboration
- ✓ Working to integrate the faith communities into the systems design of ending homelessness

Workforce Capacity Building

- ✓ Address workforce shortages and skill gaps
- ✓ Competency and compensation analysis and gap research
- ✓ Competency framework across spectrum of services and roles
- ✓ Pilot projects for training and opportunities to enhance post-secondary programs
- √ Skills framework for Complex Needs supports and housing
- ✓ Enhance capacity for employing people with lived/living experience in the sector

Moving Forward to Functional Zero

- ✓ Our discoveries, recommendations and priority actions all culminate to create a broader vision of systems integration
- ✓ Journey Home will continue to lead and partner on existing priority areas and monitor community level progress
- ✓ Journey Home will continue our scope beyond current efforts as our role encompasses all facets of the system, and our intersecting partners on the periphery
- ✓ Provide a full review of the Journey Home Strategy in Summer 2021; with a recalibration of priorities based on achievements to date and resource capacity

Moving Forward to Functional Zero Key Priority Areas

- ✓ Data integration sector-wide to inform systems improvement/measure progress
- ✓ Complex Needs Care Housing Advocacy
- ✓ Increasing and building local operator capacity
- ✓ Community anti-stigma education and communications including a public facing outcomes dashboard
- ✓ Sustainability and enhancement of the lived experience lens and peer supports in policy and decision planning
- ✓ Funds development and service procurement for journey home sustainability and systemwide investment opportunities
- ✓ Enhancement and sustainability of the youth homelessness strategy.
