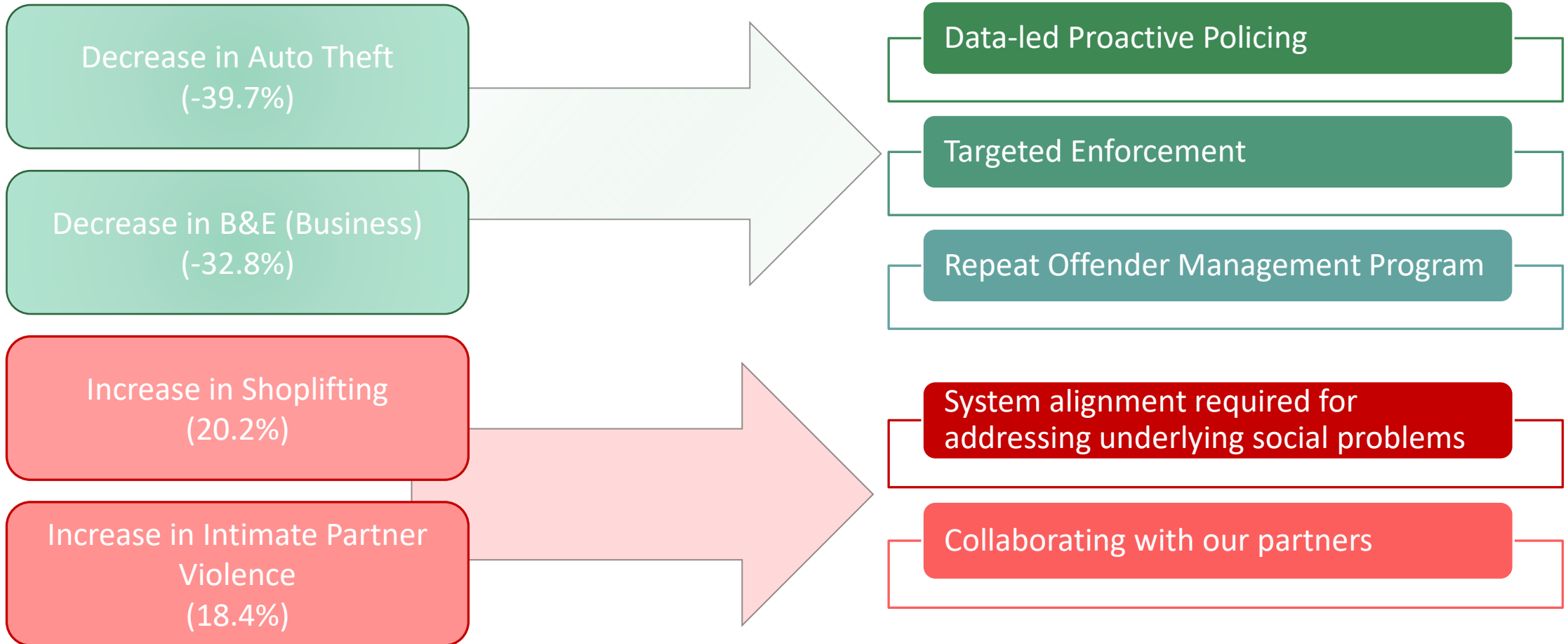

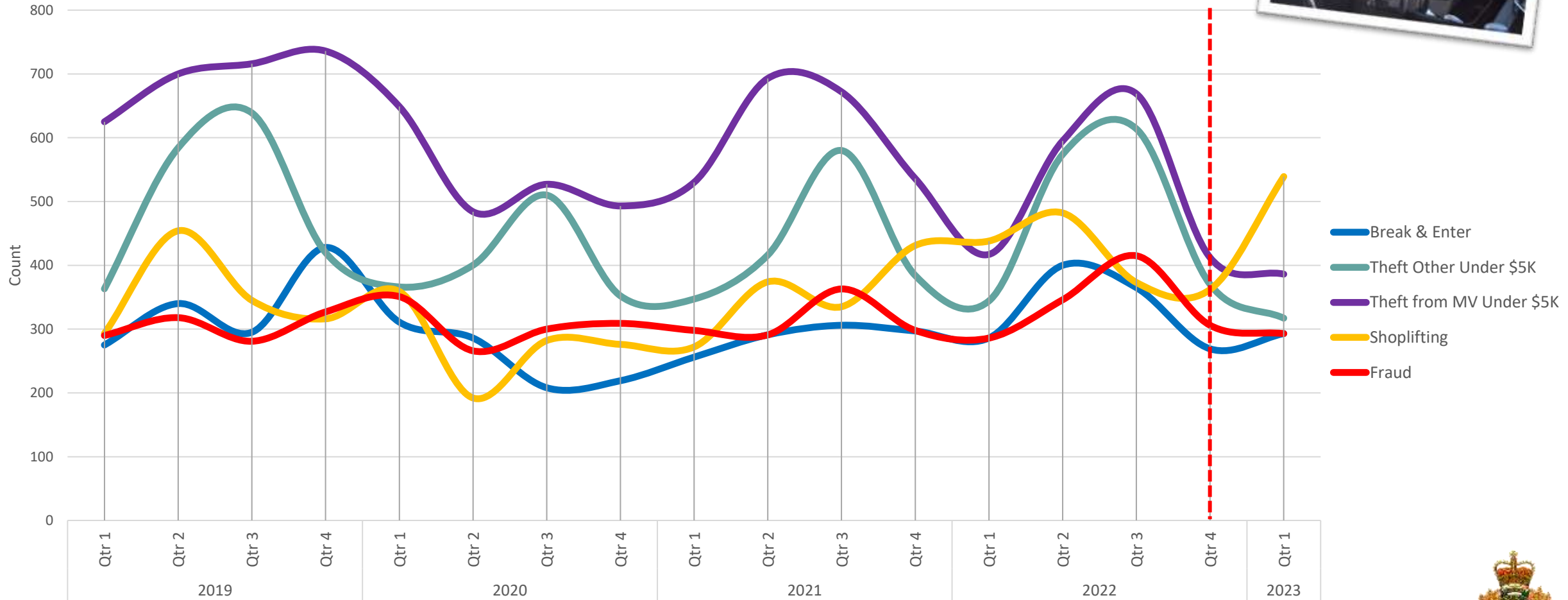
Q1 2023 Trends & Police Responses

Property Crime Driving CSI

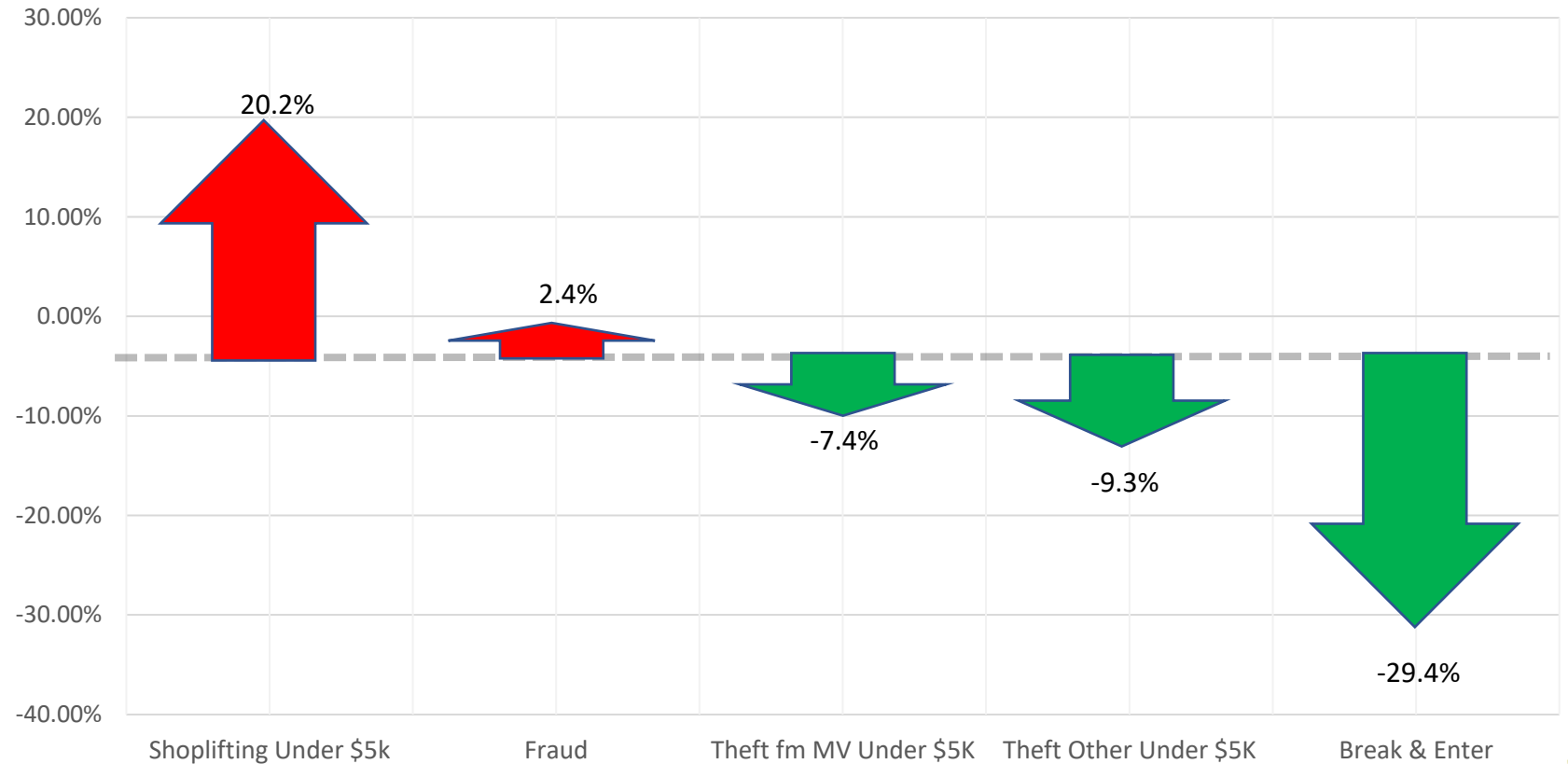

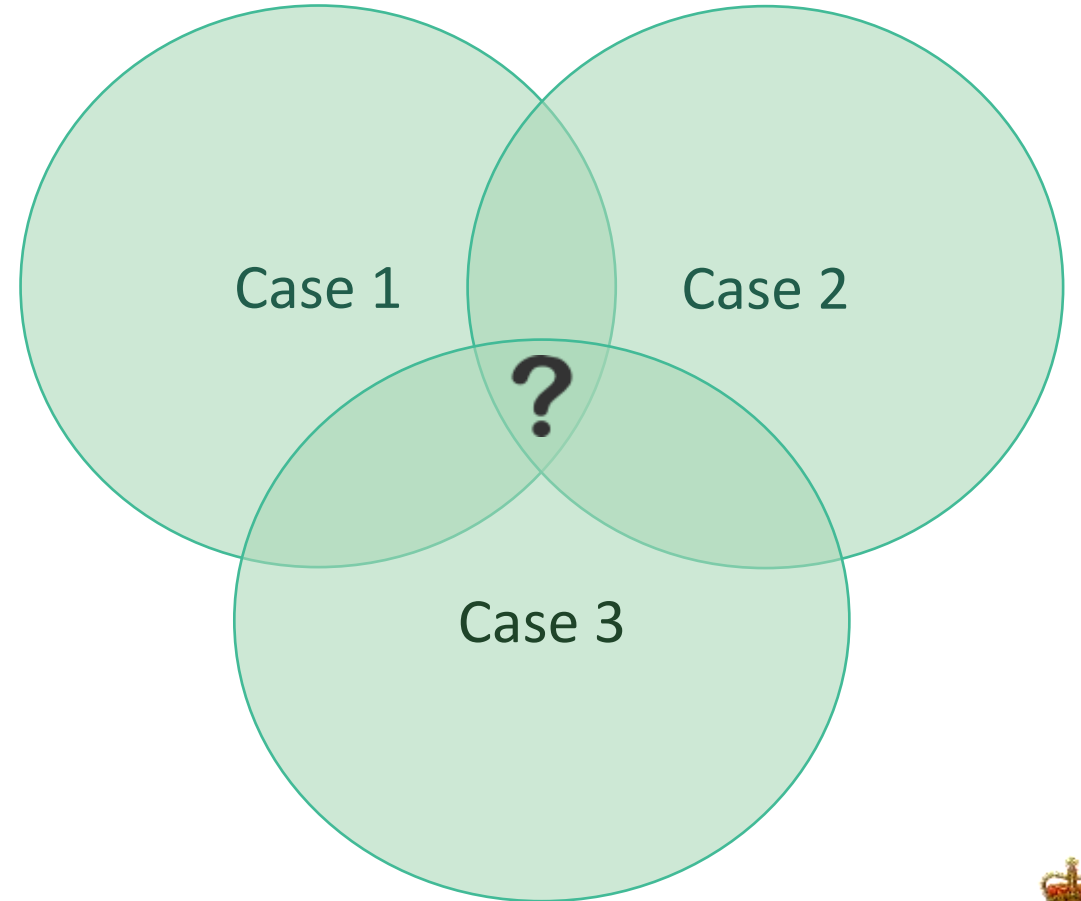

- Kelowna Integrated Court is effective yet at capacity





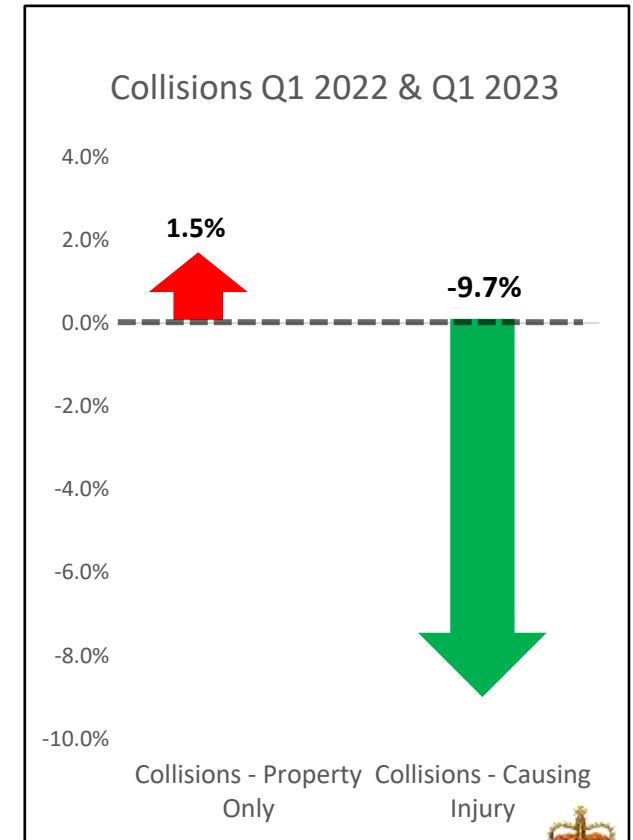
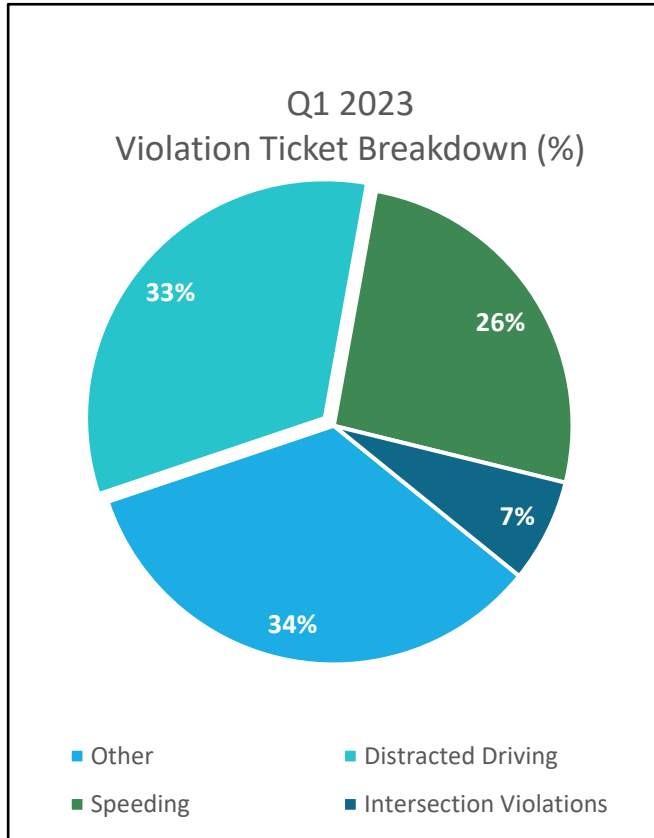
