


Council Policy 359 – Liquor Licencing Policy

- ► Current version was completed February 2011
- ► The landscape for liquor has evolved significantly over past decade
- ► LCRB has made changes to licencing names and types
- ► Modernization of the policy was needed
- ► Removing policy relating to siting of establishments

Changes to Council Policy 359

- ► Expand policy to include all license types
- ▶ New map outlining the "Central Area"
- New policy for Hours of Operation to reflect existing practices
- New guidance for considering establishments with greater than 500 person capacity
- Removal of siting requirements
- New policy for Temporary Changes to liquor licenses to reflect existing practices
- ► Notification requirements to align with Council Policy 367

Other Proposed Policy Changes

- ► Council Policy 223 Liquor Licenses in Parks, Stadiums, and Facilities
 - ► Amendments to align with current practices:
 - ► Events may have licensed cannabis use
 - Organized liquor and cannabis events may take place in various public areas
- ► Council Policy 310 Designated Driver Awareness Program
 - Rescind Policy
 - Duplicates requirements of LCRB

Changes following Council Workshop Additional Consideration Criteria

- ► Additional criteria added to Policy for Council and Staff to consider:
 - ▶ Input from internal departments and external agencies
 - Surrounding land uses and general impacts on neighbourhood
 - Proximity to other establishments
 - ► Public input

Changes following Council Workshop Patio Hours

- More permissive hours for outdoor patios that are unlikely to have an impact on existing or future residential uses:
 - ▶ 12 AM closing time for outdoor patios where the following criteria are met:
 - ▶ Located outside the Central Area
 - ► Subject property not designated or zoned for residential uses
 - ► Adjacent or abutting properties not designated or zoned for residential uses

Changes following Council Workshop Signage

- ► Additional requirements for public notification:
 - ► Requirement for signage for all applications
 - Authority for Development Planning Department Manager to require greater notification distance

Update Liquor Process

- ► Applicants make application through LCRB Portal.
- ► City of Kelowna is notified and reaches out to applicants with how to apply through local government.
- ▶ Application is circulated and reviewed to Council Policy 359.
- ▶ Forwarded for council consideration.
- ▶ Resolution provided to LCRB.

Current Timelines

- ▶ All applications are required to go to a Public Hearing.
- ▶ The number of Public Hearings has been reduced over recent years.
- ▶ Proposing three streams for Local Government input depending on the application type.

Delegation of Authority

- ► All new applications (Liquor Primary and Manufacturing Licences) with a capacity of 99 persons or less.
- ▶ All changes to an existing licence where the total capacity is still 99 persons or less.
- ▶ Patron Participation Endorsement applications where the capacity does not exceed 250 persons.

Medium Establishments

- ▶ Defined as establishments with a capacity between 100 250 persons
- Will be considered at a Monday Afternoon meeting
- ▶ Increases the availability of council meetings from 10 to approximately 33
- ► Council will continue to have option to forward to a Public Hearing

Large Establishments

- ▶ Defined as establishments with a capacity exceeding 250 persons
- ▶ No changes proposed, will be considered by council at a Public Hearing

Development Application Fees Bylaw Deferral of Annual Increase

- 1. Software Replacement:
 - Current software system not being maintained
 - b. New software system will auto calculate fees
 - More effective use of Staff resources
 - d. More clarity for applicants
- ▶ 5% increase would take effect January 1, 2026

Staff Recommendation

- ► Staff recommend **support** for the proposed changes
 - ▶ Updated to align with current licensing regime and practices
 - Modernized to address changes in liquor consumption and operations of establishments
 - Revised in consideration of feedback from Council
- ▶ Updated process with result in quicker decisions
- ▶ Updated Fees Bylaw aligns with the new stream of applications and supports implementation of new systems
