According to 2017 census data, 36,350 people - 23.8% of Kelowna's population - reported having a disability. This has likely increased.

 - New technology
 - Increased understanding of accessibility challenges





Feedback Mechanism




Accessible BC Act requires municipalities to create a tool to receive public feedback on Accessibility
