



Our People Trend: Regional Connections Drive Growth

- ► Migration from BC and other provinces
- ► High housing costs in Metro Van
- ► Employment opportunities in BC
- ► Adding more young adults







- ► Strong business climate
- ► Tech sector expands by 11%
- ► Building permits up by 33%
- Median household income growth
- Small increase in annual Unemployment rate




Our Economy Trend: Tourism Boosted



- ► Room revenue up 10%
- ► Occupancy rates up 3%
- Low gas prices and weak dollar contributed to this trend

Annual hotel room revenue (\$ millions)



Our Homes Highlights

- ► Significant amount of multi-unit development
 - ▶ 60% of building permits issued
- ► Increasing affordability challenges
 - ► Median cost of single detached house (\$500,000)
- ► Highly constrained rental market
 - ▶ Forecast to improve in 2018, incentives in place






Our Homes Trend: Housing Boom?



- ► Highest building permit statistics since 2008
- ► Current growth driven by:
 - Multi-family projects
 - ► Student housing around UBCO

Number of Building Permits Issued Annually










Where are people coming from to buy Okanagan real estate?

Our Environment Highlights

- Water conservation
 - Drought in July 2015
 - City utility introduced restrictions
 - ▶ July to Sept was down 8 per cent from 10 year average
 - ► Summer household consumption down from 2012


Monthly household water consumption for Kelowna utility







- ▶ Only 52% of Kelowna citizens on city utility
- ▶ Other 48% served by other water purveyors
- ➤ Significant number of residents are lacking access to clean, safe, and sustainable water
