








Disturbed / Encroached










Mill Creek Linear Park Vision:




Lower Mill Creek Linear Park Routing








Trail Types – Adjacent the Creek




Flood Condition Mill Creek Trail (Flood mitigation works by Utility Planning)








Mill Creek Sidewalk Types









Phasing

Acquisition Strategy

- Short-term: 1-5 years
 - Bune Ave Park (Complete in July 2025)
 - Riverside to Abbot St. Wayfinding
 - Richter to Burne Ave (Trail)
- Medium-term: 5-10 years
 - Okanagan Lake Gateway (Park Gateway)
 - Okanagan Lake Gateway Trail (Abbott St.)
- Long-term: 10-20 years
 - · Pacific Ct. Park (Lindahl St.)
 - Parkinson Recreation (Park Gatewa
 - Brookside Park (shared street)
