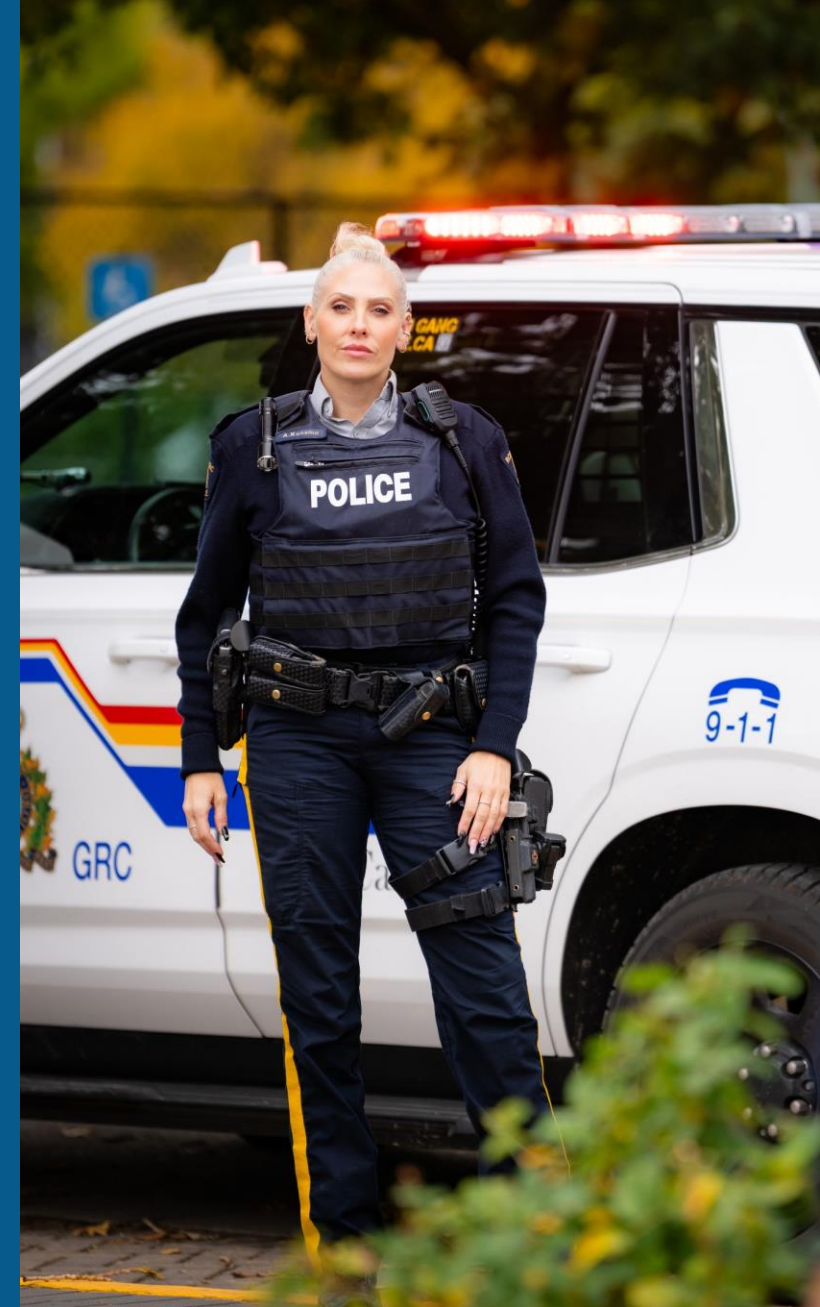

Indicators reflect Council Priorities and Kelowna RCMP's corresponding Strategic Plan

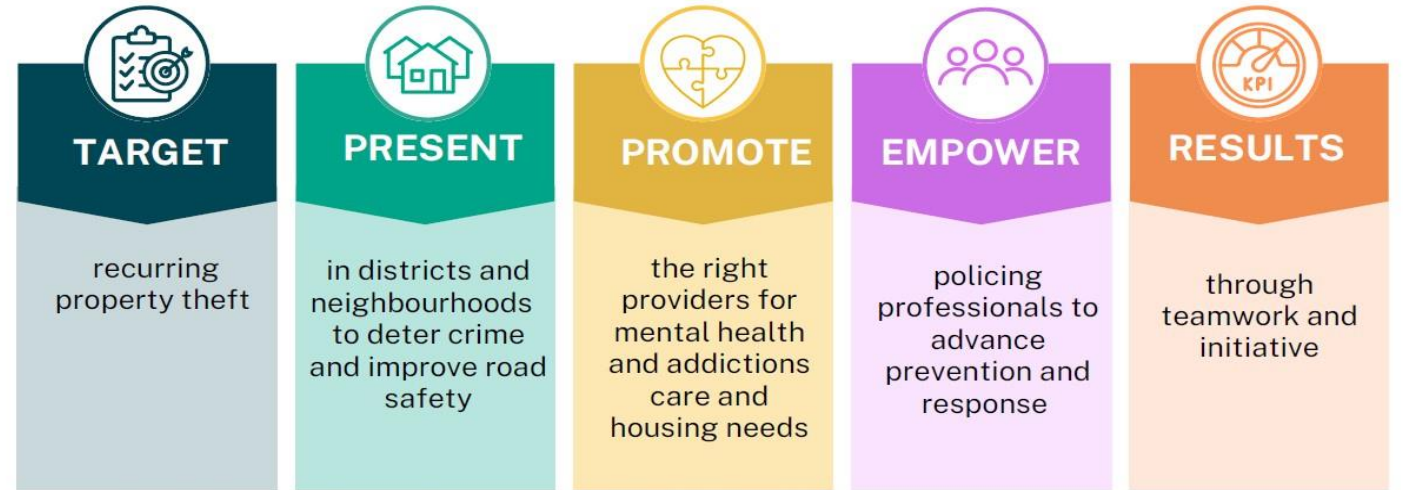
Council 2023-2026 Priorities

Repeat property crime and visible disorder remain acute in specific places



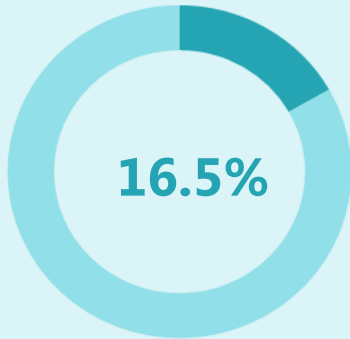

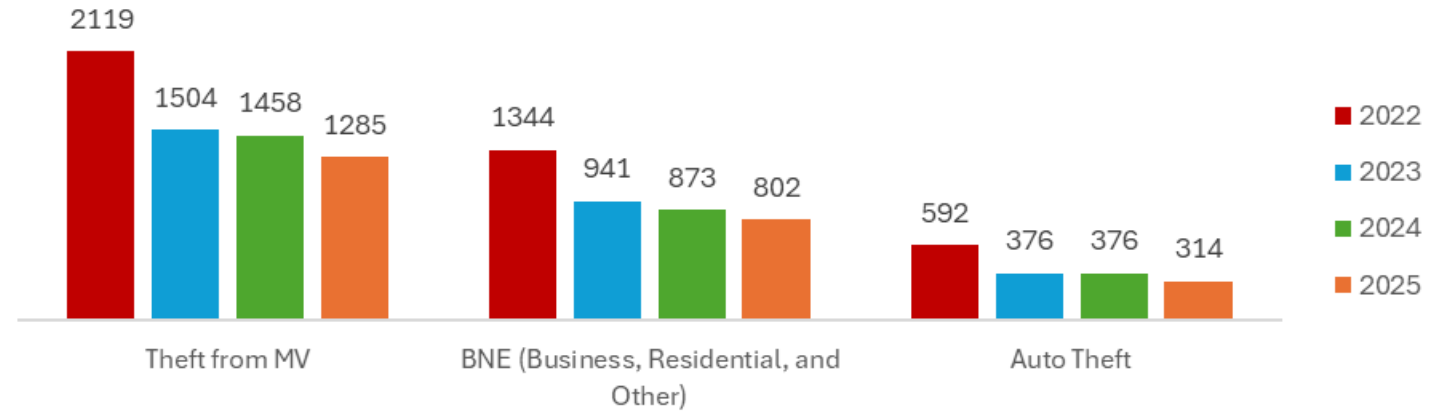

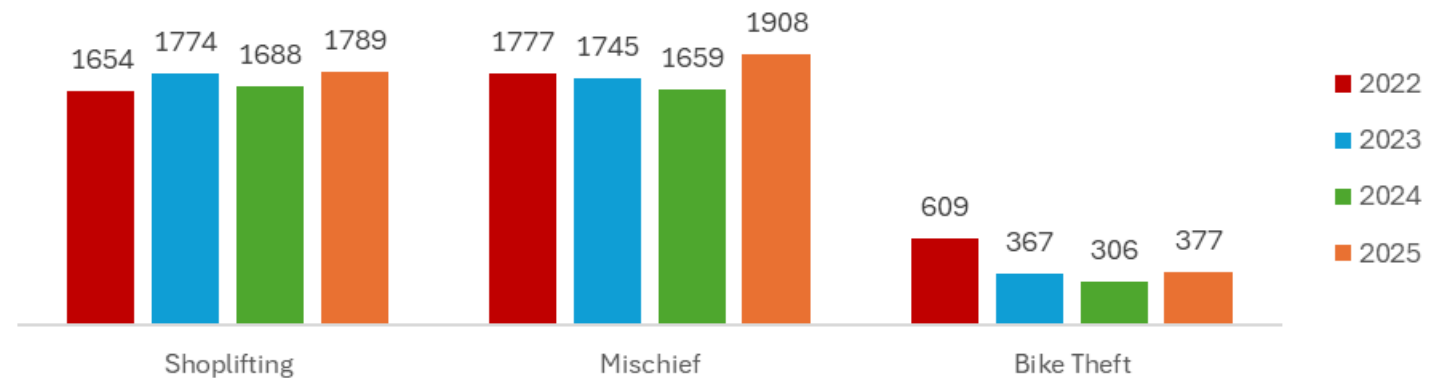

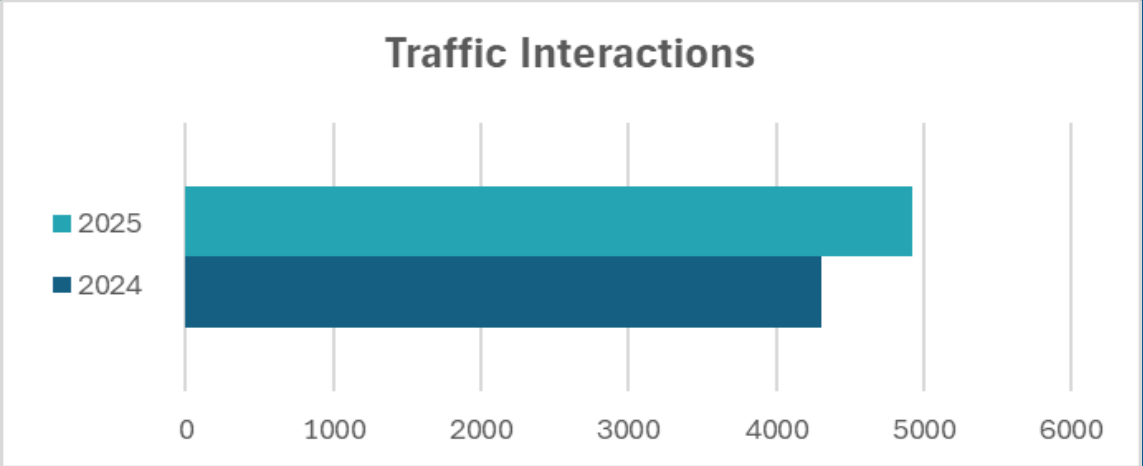


Transportation Safety
